Celebration of 77th Anniversary of Independence of Sri Lanka at the Embassy -04/02/2025

The Embassy celebrated the 77th Anniversary of the Independence of Sri Lanka with a series of vibrant events attended by Sri Lankan expatriates, staff and families.

The celebrations commenced in the morning with a flag-hoisting ceremony at the Embassy premises and the singing of the national anthem.

The ceremony included multi-faith religious observances, paying tribute to Sri Lanka's diverse heritage. Official messages from the President, Prime Minister, and Foreign Minister of Sri Lanka were read, highlighting the country's commitment to democracy, good governance, and sustainable development. A two-minute silence was observed in honour of national heroes.









Diplomatic Reception celebrating 77th Anniversary of Independence of Sri Lanka -04/02/2025

Diplomatic reception was held at the MiMi Hotel in Ankara with the presence of H. E. Ms. Celile Eren Ökten, Deputy Minister of National Education of Türkiye as the Guest of Honour.

Over 350 distinguished guests, including Turkish parliamentarians, politicians, government officials, members of the diplomatic corps, Turkish academic and business leaders, those representing arts and culture, attended the event, which underscored the strong and enduring diplomatic partnership between Sri Lanka and Türkiye.





The Guest of Honour, Her Excellency Celile Eren Ökten, Deputy Minister of National Education of Türkiye, commended Sri Lanka's progress and reaffirmed Türkiye's commitment to deepening collaboration in multiple sectors. She acknowledged the longstanding friendship between the two nations, highlighting Sri

Lanka's support to Türkiye during its time of need. She mentioned that *"Türkiye and Sri Lanka share a bond of mutual respect and solidarity. We are committed to expanding our partnerships in education, trade, and cultural exchanges to benefit both our nations."*



In her address at the diplomatic reception, H.E. the Ambassador Saranya Hasanthi Urugodawatte Dissanayake highlighted Sri Lanka's progress towards economic recovery and stability. *"Sri Lanka is firmly on the path to economic resilience, marking a significant turnaround from past challenges. We have prioritized transparency, good governance, and sustainable economic policies to build a prosperous future,"* she stated.

The Ambassador also emphasized the historical ties between Sri Lanka and Türkiye, rooted in centuries-old trade and cultural exchanges, and expressed confidence in further strengthening bilateral cooperation in trade, investment, and tourism in the coming year.



The diplomatic reception was further enhanced by a captivating traditional Sri Lankan dance performance that showcased the island's rich cultural heritage, presented by two Sri Lankan medical students studying at Tbilisi State Medical University in Georgia.

Ambassadors shared their views on challenges and sacrifices that diplomats have to face, which is not usually not known by public and the importance of continuously and rapidly being updated about what is happening in the world, importance of networking and what it takes to represent one's country. Ambassador of Sri Lanka especially highlighted the additional challenges faced by female diplomats and challenges faced by particularly children moving from one country to another as well as role of diplomats in preventing conflicts and as peace builders.
